Our Career Centers Love Getting Involved!

Right now, The Arc currently has 7 Career Centers throughout Middlesex County. These centers help individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities learn many different useful skills that can be applied to everyday life. The Career Centers emphasize the development of skills for social, physical, emotional and vocational growth. Individuals have the opportunity to interact through task training, education and community integration. We also offer job exploration. The Career Centers assist participants to achieve their goals in the following areas: independent living skills, community integrations skills, educational development, career planning, interpersonal relations, communication skills, etc.

In our T.E.C.H. Center, they also learn how to use computers and ipads for sending emails, writing letters, using social media, finding information on the web and much, much more!

We also have two used bookstores that are operated by the participants in the Career Centers. This provides them retail/sales training experience which is very helpful when searching for a job!
